Once again this year we are asking the Faith Community Committee to help with finding volunteers. Last year we had over 120 volunteers. At the last meeting members of the committee were asked to go back to their communities to get an estimate for the number of volunteers. We have added one zone (16 to 17), groups of 2-3 people who go from 6-8am in the morning and 8-10 at night plus a 2-hour orientation (total time commitment of 6 hours)

How the FCC can Help

Church bulletins and emails. Once you have a landlord, contact Anne Lansing who will help to put them in touch with Sandy Latty, the contact person for landlords. The City has CoC Rental Assistance Vouchers that are targeted to homeless but landlords don't really understand or need to know the difference.

Religious Leaders Training

Sofia, Dan, Than, Michael Watkins, Cory Marquez are coordinating a religious leaders training. The training will be broad in terms of what churches are doing and how that works in collaboration with the City of Pasadena. Topics of discussion will include what to do when there is someone who is homeless (call 2-1-1, CES Rep), resources in community, explaining the FCC vision and Pasadena Partnership vision. The committee will be inviting city council reps.

The intent is that this training will be a springboard for future homeless workshops. At the end of the training a pledge card will be passed out with items such as volunteering for the homeless count, attending the FCC, and various other opportunities to end homelessness included in it.

Training will be at Lake Avenue Church (skyroom), Tuesday, October 25th 6-8pm, dinner will be provided. Hoping to get around 70 people.
