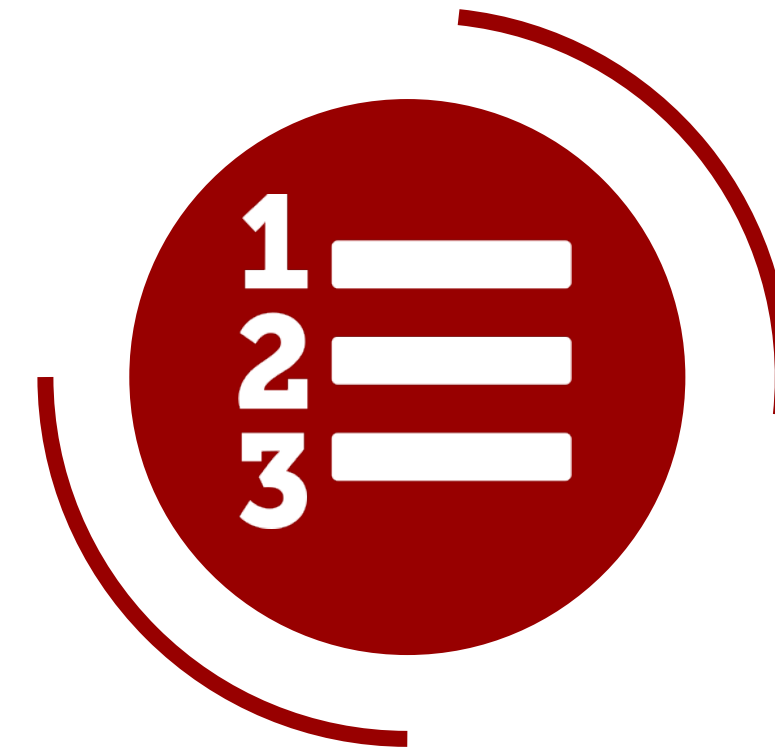

Overview of the Competition



Available Funding

Approximately \$2.3 billion in funding is available to CoCs nationwide



Tiering & Selection

Projects will be assigned a score and ranked accordingly



Competitive NOFA

Strong emphasis on selecting high performing projects that will enhance System Performance

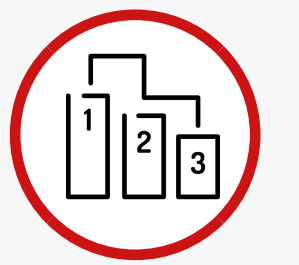


Competition Deadline

The deadline for submitting applications to HUD is 5 p.m. on September 30, 2019



HUD's Policy Priorities



ENDING HOMELESSNESS

Identify, engage, and effectively serve all people experiencing homelessness.



SYSTEMATIC RESPONSE

Use of system performance measures, such as length of time homeless, returns to homelessness and exits to PH, to determine effectiveness.



STRATEGIC ALLOCATION

Using cost, performance, and outcome data, CoCs should improve how resources are utilized to end homelessness.



EVIDENCE-BASED APPROACH

Employ strong use of data and evidence, including cost-effectiveness, positive housing outcomes, recovery, self-sufficiency and reducing homelessness



INCREASING EMPLOYMENT

Projects should work with local employment agencies and employers to prioritize training and employment opportunities for people experiencing homelessness



CoC Consolidated Application

Three parts



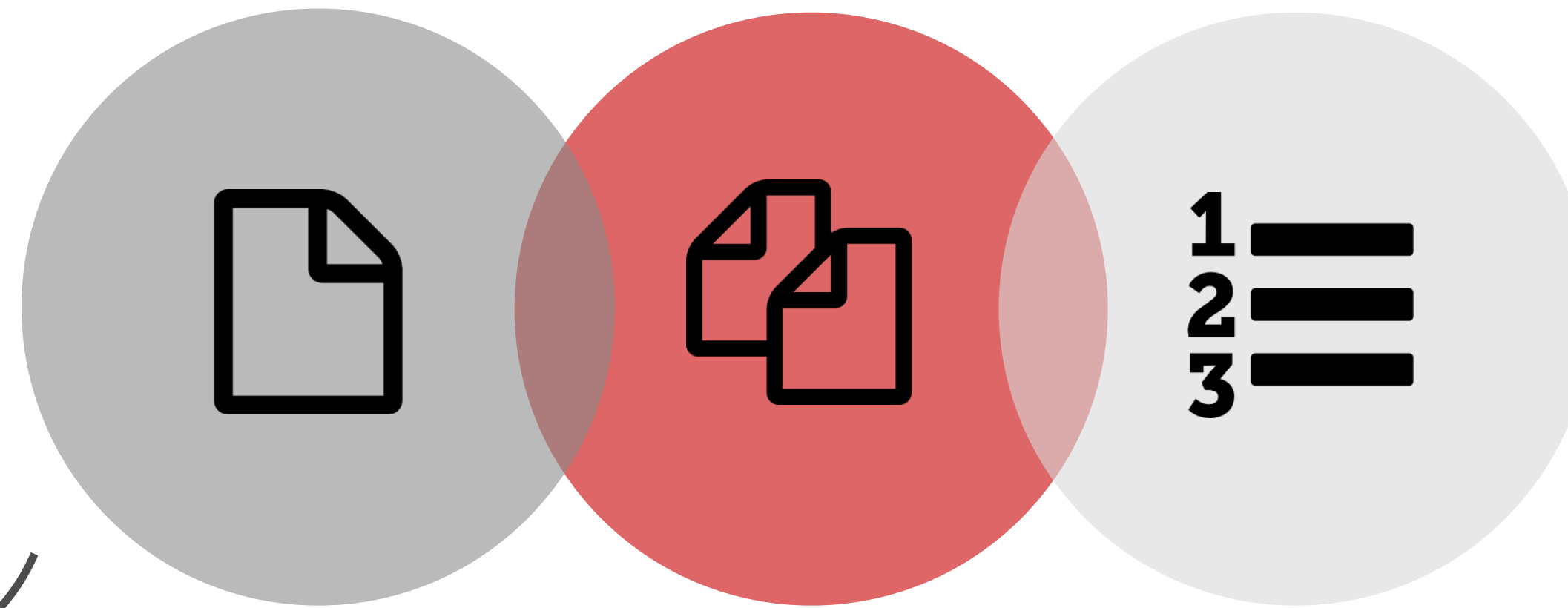
Project Applications

New and renewal permanent housing, supportive service only, HMIS and planning grant projects.

CoC Application

Completed by the Collaborative Applicant and contains information on:

The CoC planning body
Governance structure
Overall performance
Strategic planning process



CoC Priority Listing

Ranks projects in order of priority and identifies any project applications rejected by the CoC

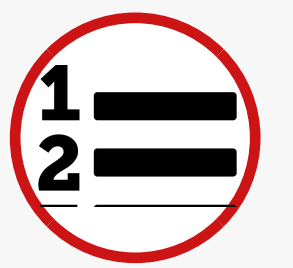

Tiering

HUD Review Process



All projects, except the CoC planning grant must be ranked

Tier 1

94% of ARD (\$3,267,453)

New and renewal projects determined by the CoC to be high priority, high performing, and meet the needs and gaps of the system.

Projects will be conditionally funded by HUD, provided the applications pass eligibility and threshold review.

Tier 2

6% of ARD + Bonus (\$372,675)*

*Not including amounts available for this year's Domestic Violence bonus

Remaining new and renewal projects.

Scoring is based on three criteria:

1. CoC application score
2. Ranked position of project application
3. HUD's eligibility & threshold requirements

1. System Performance Measures
2. Low-barrier Programs and Systems
3. Reallocation and Ranking Based on Project Performance
4. Strengthening Coordinated Entry
5. Collaboration with Community Partners
6. Addressing the Needs of Subpopulations
7. Using Data Well

9. Identifying and Addressing Racial Disparities

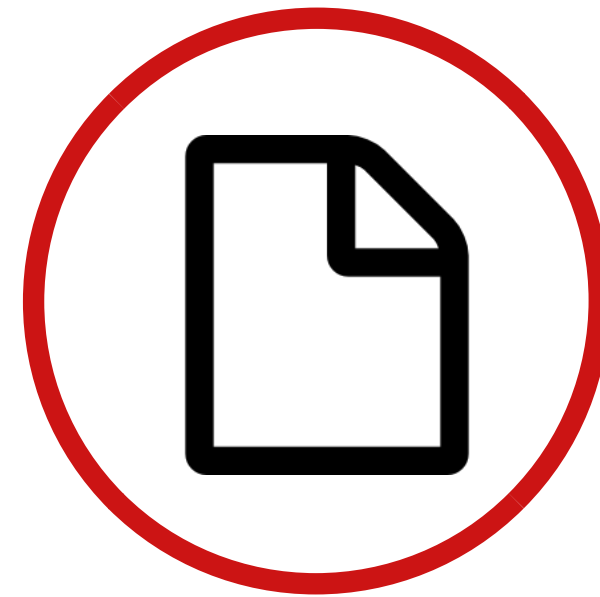

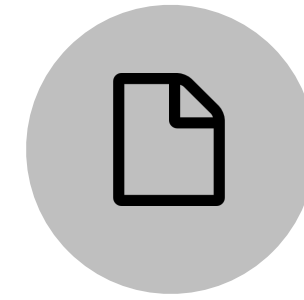

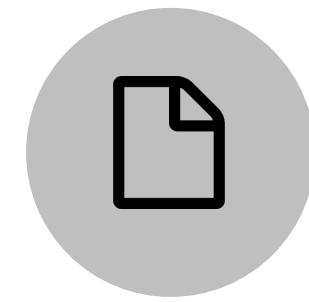

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Active SAM registration
2. DUNS number
3. Participation in HMIS + CES
4. 25% Match (excluding leasing)
5. Project eligibility & cost requirements
6. Must request full 10% admin



Bonus Funding

Permanent Supportive Housing: \$173,339



CoC PSH Bonus

- Only eligible activity is permanent supportive housing
- New or expansion projects can apply
- Must serve individuals or families that are chronically homeless who have been referred through CES

If awarded funding, projects may be eligible to apply for renewal in the FY 2020 competition



Bonus Funding

Domestic Violence: \$145,474



Rapid Rehousing (DV RRH)

- Eligible for 5 additional bonus points
- Housing & supportive services should demonstrate and implement trauma-informed, victim centered approaches that address immediate safety needs
- Grant Term must be 1 year

If awarded funding, projects may be eligible to apply for renewal in the FY 2020 competition

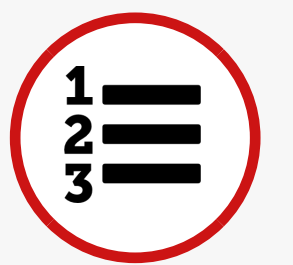
Supportive Services Only-Coordinated Entry (DV SSO-CE)

- Projects should implement policies, practices and procedures that equip the CoC's coordinated entry to better meet the needs of DV survivors who are experiencing homelessness
- Project should be trauma-informed & client centered
- Project should better coordinate referrals between CES and victim service providers to prioritize safety

New Projects



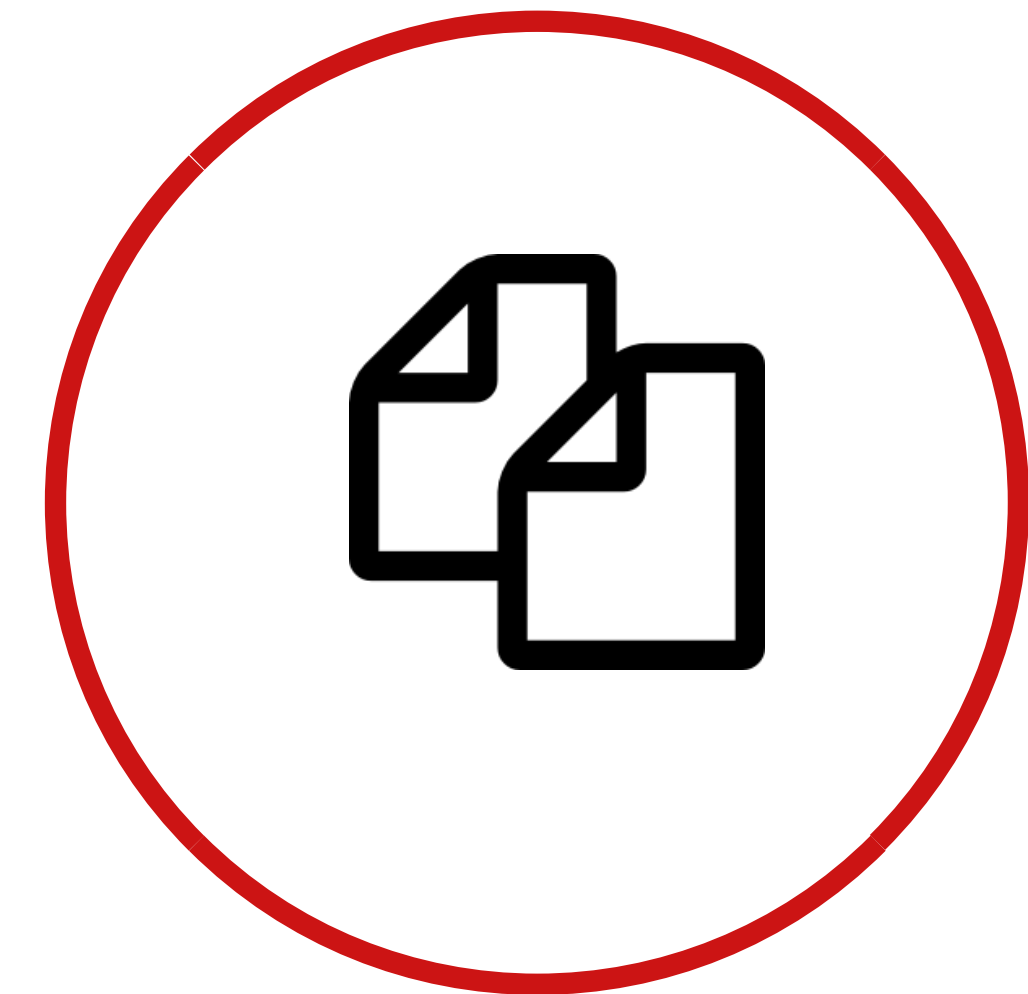
EVALUATION PANEL

Review and score RFA responses
Makes project inclusion recommendations to the Board



COC BOARD REVIEW

Meets to review panel's recommendations
Provides final approval of projects to be included in the consolidated application



E SNAPS SUBMISSION

City staff compiles information for projects that have been selected for inclusion into e-snaps

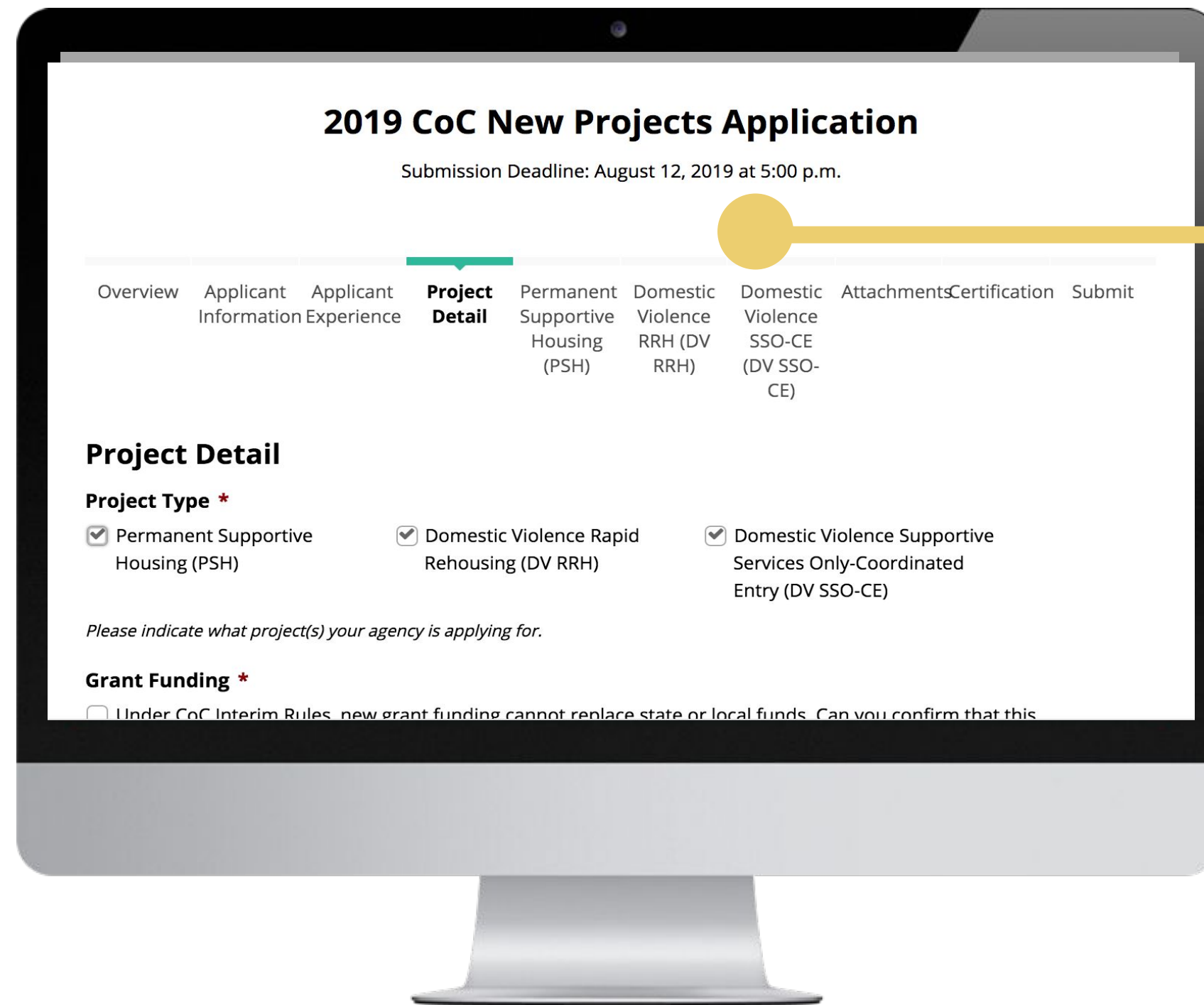

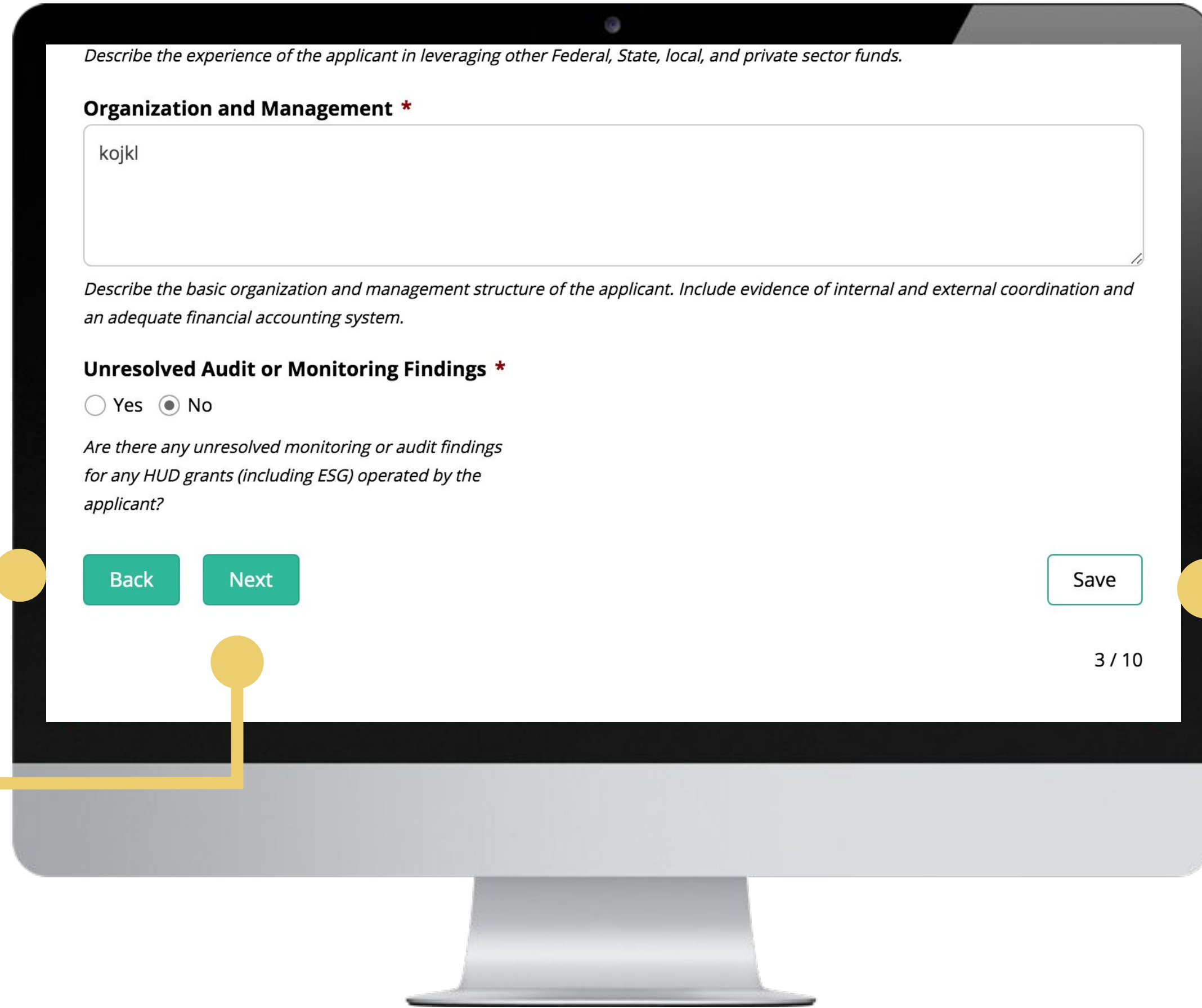

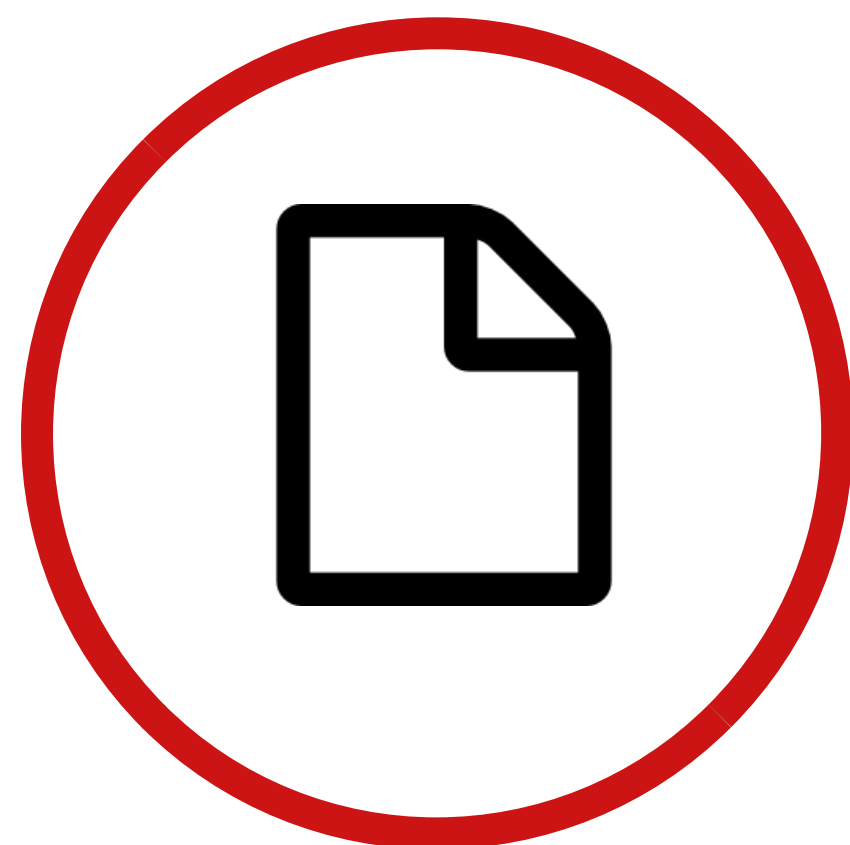
